## *Navigation Panels Read Me*

The theme includes an advanced popup navigation panel that allows you to add text, icons or images to your navigation. The menu icon can also be customized.

While it looks complicated, it is rather easy to define your Navigation Panel in a few steps.

To add the custom content to the Navigation Panel, under Settings / Code / Body, you will need to add some code for each page in the panel. 5 styles are included or you may create your own. Each varies according to your content, but generally work the same.

### **Navigation Options**

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Note: All layouts with Panels requires code.

**Standard Nav** – Regular Navigation

**Panels** – Show Navigation Panels

**Nav Toggle** – Hides Standard Navigation behind toggle below Panels

**extraContent20** – Replaces Panels with extraContent20 with toggle below.

**Helper Mode** – Reveals RW page titles above panels that they link to

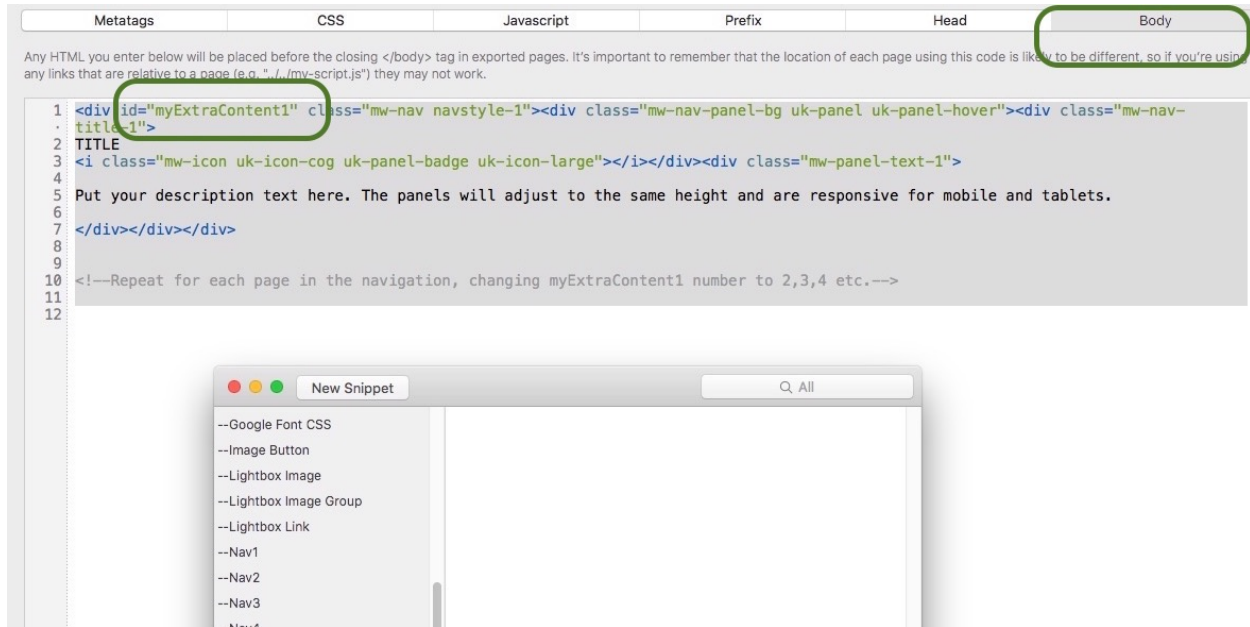
### **Navigation Panels >960**

Choose 2–3–4 panels for desktop width windows, responsive at smaller window sizes.

## Instructions

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Use the Nav1 snippet and drag to Settings / Body for your site [not an individual page]. Duplicate the code block for the number of pages in your top navigation. If you have Home, Blog, Store and Info as your main pages you would need 4 blocks. Change the 'extraContent1' code on the second block to 'extraContent2' and so on.



**\*You must match each page in your navigation to a code block 1,2,3 etc, missing or additional blocks will break your layout\***

If you see that your navigation is not working correctly, double check that you have the correct number of code blocks. If you add a page in RW you will need up update your block numbers.

Here is the code for the first layout option:

```
<div id="myExtraContent1" class="mw_nav_class">
<div class="mw-nav uk-panel uk-panel-box uk-panel-hover">
<i class="uk-icon-info-circle uk-panel-badge uk-icon-large"> </i>
<div class="uk-panel-title mw_nav_title ">
```

<div class="mw\_nav\_text">

Put your description text here. The panels will adjust to the same height and are responsive for mobile and tablets. You can put <a href="#">LINKS</a> or any other HTML in this area. Repeat for each page in the navigation, changing number to 2,3,4 etc. </div></div></div>

Here is how you use each area:

<div id="myExtraContent1" class="mw\_nav\_class">

This is for each page in your navigation, you should change "myExtraContent1" for each page, ie, "myExtraContent3" "myExtraContent3" etc. You must have a code set for every page of your navigation or it will not appear. Numbers must also be sequential, no skipping numbers, as in 1,2,4,5,7. This may cause issues. EC blocks 1-20 are reserved for navigation only.

<div class="mw-nav uk-panel uk-panel-box uk-panel-hover">

This sets up how the panels appear, varies for each layout. The theme uses the UIKit framework, so you can alter this as you see fit, but can be left as is.

<i class="uk-icon-info-circle uk-panel-badge uk-icon-large"> </i>

This defines your icon for each page, along with the size.

"uk-icon-info-circle" is the name of the icon, see the accompanying instructions on how to get the icon names. Note there is a space after the icon-name. Also, this should go first in the list.

"uk-panel-badge" positions the icon. Again, not necessary to change unless you wish.

"uk-icon-large" defines the icon size. There are several predefined sizes, or this can be defined using the CSS code if you wish.

<div class="uk-panel-title mw\_nav\_title ">

Defines the style of your title.

This is the actual name of your page, does not have to correspond to the name used in Rapidweaver. Make sure not to delete the trailing </div>

Defines your text layout and style. May be modified using CSS.

After this code, you would need to define the next page in your navigation:

```
div id="myExtraContent2" class="mw_nav_class">
<div class="mw-nav uk-panel uk-panel-box uk-panel-hover">
<i class="uk-icon-info-circle uk-panel-badge uk-icon-large"></i>
<div class="uk-panel-title mw_nav_title ">

Do this for each page of your navigation. Note that the order of “myExtraContent1 — 5” follows the order of the pages as you have them arranged in Rapidweaver. Adding additional pages or re-arranging any of the Top Pages of your site will change where each panel links.

### Nav Style 3 – Images

Nav3 uses images in the panels. You will need to use exact URLs for the images, not the resource macro. Rapidweaver places the site wide Body code in the page after it processes its macros, so it will look like a missing image. You can add the images to Resources and use the ‘Copy URL’ button to get the address. Site will need to be published once to place the images on your server.

### Navigation Icon [Hamburger Menu]

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To change icon, copy the following Snippet to the Code / Javascript area in Settings / Javascript for your **site**

```
//changes nav menu icon  
$("#navButton").removeClass('uk-icon-cog uk-icon-small').addClass('uk-icon-bank uk-icon-large');
```

Leave the `.removeClass` code. After `.addClass`, change 'uk-icon-bank' to your chosen icon name.

Example: changing icon to **caret-square-o-left** / **medium size**

```
$("#navButton").removeClass('uk-icon-cog uk-icon-small').  
.addClass('uk-icon-caret-square-o-left uk-icon-medium');
```

The icon color and background color can be changed in RW page settings.

## Menu Toggle for Full Navigation

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In the popup menu, there is an option to have your full site navigation show by clicking a toggle at the bottom. To put text on the navigation toggle button, such as 'Site Menu', place code under Code/Body in Settings [code is in a Snippet]:

```
<div id="myExtraContent21">  
Site Menu  
</div>
```

**PRO TIP:**

**While it is technically possible to duplicate the entire code and place it on each individual page in the Page Inspector / Body area instead, DO NOT DO IT. Really, really not recommended. Very bad idea. Also, no support if you do this. Did I mention it was not a good idea?**

However, if for some reason you need to do this, you must place it on each individual page. You cannot put the code in the site settings Body area and try to override it for a few pages, you will end up with the navigation text showing up on your main page.
